### FROM POINTS WEST:

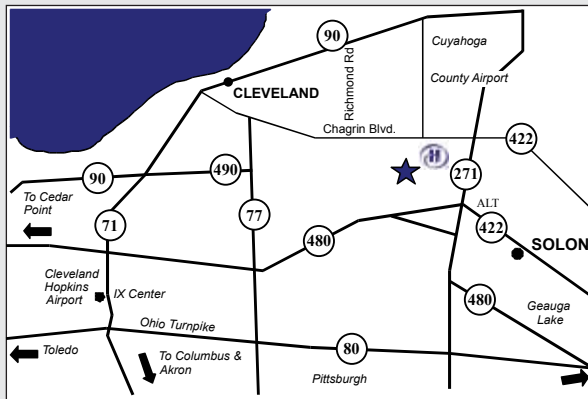
Follow I-480 East to I-271 (local lanes) North to Chagrin Blvd. Turn left and follow to first street which is Park East Drive and turn left.

Mariette Hartley is an Emmy Award-winning (and six times nominated) Best Actress. She has established herself as an enduring star on stage, in five television series, countless television movies, and more than a dozen feature films.

Born in Weston, Connecticut, she is the granddaughter of John B. Watson, the internationally renowned psychologist who founded the school of behaviorism and who taught that children were to be trained, not touched or nurtured. Her warm and affectionate personality is a stunning contrast to her upbringing. After Mariette's father died by gunshot, she and her mother kept his suicide a secret for years. A family history of bipolar disorder led to the suicides of her uncle and beloved cousin and to her mother's suicide attempt. In her 1990 best-selling autobiography, *Breaking the Silence*, she chronicled the personal memories of her childhood in a home torn apart by alcoholism and depression. She has also spoken openly about her own struggles with bipolar disorder and suicidal ideation. Once Mariette told her poignant story, she became "the spokesperson for suicide survivors."
